## Library Newsletter and Program Guide September/October 2020 Welcome Back!



Grab and Go Service @ the Copiague Library We welcome our patrons back into the library to browse and check out library materials and get information from library staff. Here are some guidelines as to what to expect during your visit to the library.



## How will my library visit be different than what I'm used to?

Library visits will be like a trip to the grocery store: with a clear purpose and for a short time. Quiet study rooms, meeting rooms and the Children's Room will not be available during your Grab and Go visit. However, Children's Room staff will be available to retrieve materials and provide information for you. There is no seating in the library.

#### What can I expect when I arrive?

The amount of people admitted to the library at one time will be limited to ensure social distancing. Social distancing markers will be placed throughout the building. All patrons are required to wear a mask in the library at all times. Public restrooms will be single use, with a key available at the Circulation Desk. Hand sanitizer stations have been placed around the library. Please be aware that the Library Café has closed.

#### Will there be computer access?

A limited amount of adult computers will be available by appointment only. Please call the library for an appointment. Teen and children's computers are not available at this time.

#### What other services are available?

Photocopiers are available for patron use in the lobby. A self-service fax machine is available for patron use in the computer area.

#### What safety measures has the library undertaken?

Protective barriers have been installed at all service desks. Social distancing markers have been placed where lines form. All returned library materials are being guarantined for 96 hours in our community room before being checked back in. Library seating has been removed and some areas of the library remain closed. All public areas are continuously cleaned by library staff.

#### What can I do to keep myself and those around me safe during my library visit?

Please do not visit the library if you have symptoms of, have tested positive for or have been exposed to someone with COVID-19. Wear a mask at all times while in the library, follow social distancing protocols, limit your time in the library, wash your hands or use hand sanitizer before, during and after your visit.

#### What about curbside service and library by mail?

Contactless curbside service for the pick-up and drop-off of library materials will continue. Please call the library and a staff member will pull your requested items for you and set-up an appointment time for you to come pick them up. All patrons picking up and dropping off items at the library are required to wear a mask. If you do not want to come to the library, we are happy to mail library materials, photocopies, crossword puzzles and other items to library patrons at no charge whenever possible. Please contact the library.

## Where should I return library materials?

Library materials can be returned in the plastic bins located outside the entrances and in the lobby. Please do not return items at the Circulation Desk (unless it is a Chromebook or Wi-Fi hotspot). The book drops remain closed.

## What about library programs?

All library programs will continue to be held online via Zoom, Facebook Live, YouTube or Discord for the foreseeable future. Check our Facebook page often, as we are always adding new programs, services and activities as we discover new ways to meet the needs of the community.

Please be aware that these re-opening plans may change at any time based on changes in government and health mandates and at the discretion of Library Administration and the Board of Trustees. 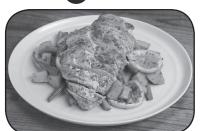
A shredding truck from Storage Quarters will be in our parking lot for on-site shredding of personal documents. Items will be shredded in front of you.

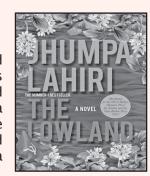


The Lowland: A Novel
